In response one elder reminds the community of shared values of helping one another and trading using the long honored tradition of el cambalache.

Olivia Romo is a farmer, poet and water rights activist from Taos, NM. She earned her dual Bachelor's degrees in English and Chicana/o Studies from the University of New Mexico in 2015. She intentionally focuses her activism and poetry to educate and mobilize New Mexicans around the risks and uncertainties of their natural resources. Her published works include the New York Times in the 2019 article "Work Songs of the Cowboy Poets". Olivia's flagship poem "Bendición del agua" was featured in the Western Folklife Center's "Moving Rural Verse" series in 2017 honoring acequia culture. She continues her journey in reclaiming her language, seeds, and stories of resilience.

2022 AWARDS

Acequia Lifetime Achievement Award Gilbert Sandoval President of the Jemez River Basin Coalition of Acequias



Gilbert Sandoval is the recipient of NMAA's Lifetime Achievement Award for 2022. He has been a Mayordomo on the East-West Sandoval Ditch for over 60 years, where he holds a special status as a respected community elder. He lives with his family along the Jemez River where he grows a garden of vegetables that he readily shares with family, neighbors, and visitors. Gilbert has been instrumental in the recently signed Pueblos of Jemez and Zia Water Rights Settlement Act, developed after years of negotiation grounded in the core values of respect and community. Through the negotiations, he worked with Pueblo and acequia leaders on water sharing agreements and plans for infrastructure investments. He has been a member of the Concilio of the NMAA for almost 25 years where his leadership has guided the organization with wisdom and steadfast commitment to the NMAA vision. He was a co-founder of the Mayordomo Project and serves as the model for mentoring his daughter Juanita Revak in the art of mayordomia. In addition to his role as an acequia leader, Gilbert is a beloved father, grandfather, and great-grandfather, husband to his deceased wife Jenny Sandoval, and active member of his faith community at Lady of the Assumption Catholic Church. He retired from the US Forest Service and served over 30 years as a volunteer EMT with the Jemez Spring Search and Rescue.

Acequia Community of the Year Award

Rio de las Gallinas Acequia Association

We honor the decades of dedication it took the leadership of the Rio de las Gallinas Acequia Association to finalize their difficult water rights adjudication with the City of Las Vegas. While the acequias in the region have been resilient in continuing their irrigation practices, we also acknowledge the historic loss of water rights that the area experienced. We are inspired by the determination and diligence that the regional leadership showed in their dedication to community, water, and our beloved acequias. In response to the recent fires and floods, acequias have also been vigilant in working toward their recovery by engaging in efforts to restore, repair, and rebuild acequias in their community.

Association of the Community Ditches of the Rio San Jose

We acknowledge the tremendous accomplishment of the Rio San Jose Acequia Association in completing their water rights adjudication settlement with Acoma Pueblo and Laguna Pueblo. Their advocacy for their acequias in the San Jose basin was rooted in a deep culture of stewardship and care for their precious and scarce water resources. We are grateful for their leadership in building consensus among their acequias and their neighboring Pueblos to resolve longstanding claims and to move forward for a future of greater community unity and water resilience.
